

August Court - 1723 - 96

A. Benjamin Wailes <sup>Memorandum of the p[ro]fessi[on]al fees by Francis Allen his attorney sued out his Lordships writ of  
ag<sup>t</sup> S[ecundum] Surefaire against the defendant the tenor whereof followeth in these words vizt  
John Fleetwood - Somerset County vs Charles absolute Lord and proprietor of the Province of Maryland  
and as also Lord Baron of Baltimore & to the Sheriff of Somerset County greeting Whereas a certain Benjamin  
Wailes lately in the County Court of Somerset on the eighteenth day of April in the seventh year of Our Dominion &c.  
Anno Domini One thousand Seven hundred and twenty two Before the Worshipfull Charles Ballard and his associates  
the Justices of Our said Court (at dividing Creek) and by consideration of Our said Court recovered against a certain  
John Fleetwood of Steyney parish in Somerset County plander as well the sume of two thousand Eight hundred  
and Sixty four pounds of tobacco a certain Debt, as also the sume of three hundred and fifty four pounds of  
tobacco Costs of Suit, whereof he is Comit as by the record and process thereof in Our said Court remaining  
manifestly appears, and for as much as Execution remaneth thereupon as yet to be done and because wee that  
those things which in Our said Court are rightly done and acknowledged should be brought to acte Execution  
Command you that by good and Lawfull men of your Bailiwick you make known unto the said John Fleetwood  
that he be and appear before the Justices of Our County Court to be held at Dividing Creek in Somerset County  
the third Tuesday of August next to shew cause if any thing for himself he hath or knoweth to say why  
the said Benjamin Wailes his Execution of the judgment ag<sup>t</sup> against him the said John Fleetwood according to the  
form of the Recovery of he ought not to have of him it shall be seen neare and have you then either the  
Names of those by whom you make the same known and his Writt Witness Charles Ballard Greate Cheife  
Justice of Our said Court the nineteenth day of June in the eighth year of Our Dominion &c and Dated 1723

At which said third Tuesday of August to wit the twentieth day of the same month and anno Domini  
One thousand Seven hundred and twenty three Being the day of the returne of the said Writt Comit the said  
Benjamin Wailes by his attorney ag<sup>t</sup> and the Sheriff of Somerset County to whom the foregoing Writt was  
directed likewise comit and made returne therof to the Court here holden in these words following vizt

By vertue of the within writt to me directed to the Justices within mentioned I Certifie that I have  
given Notice to the within named John Fleetwood that he be and appear at the time and place within  
mentioned to shew cause if any he have why the within mentioned Benjamin Wailes shall not have his  
Execution against him for the debt and costs within contained according to the form of the Recovery if to him  
it shall seeme neare before Abraham Ingram and Samuel Oliver good and Lawfull men of my Bailiwick  
as by the within Writt same command to answer Joseph Maclester Esq -

Where upon the said Benjamin Wailes by his attorney ag<sup>t</sup> prays that the said John Fleetwood  
to his writ of Surefaire ag<sup>t</sup> may answer But the said John Fleetwood altho' Solemly called Comit not  
nor shew cause why & but under default whereby the said p[ro]fessi[on]al fees against the said deft thereof  
undebted - Therefore it is considered by the Justices here the twentieth day of August -

and anno Domini One thousand Seven hundred and twenty three ag<sup>t</sup> that the said Benjamin Wailes have  
his Execution against the said John Fleetwood for as well the sume of two thousand Eight hundred
