aforesaid in Somerset County aforesaid within the Jurisdiction of this Court with force & arms & in and upon
and feet in and upon the said George an negro Slave of him the said William an assault he did make
and him the said George then and there he did Beat wound and Evil Entreat so that of his Life
it was greatly despained by Reason whereof the said William the Service of his Negro Slave aforesaid
by a long time to wit from the aforesaid sixth day of March in the Year aforesaid until the first day of June then next
Ensuing did loose and other harms to the said Negro George then and there did against the Peace
of the Right honorable the Lord Proprietary that Now is his good Rule and Government. whereupon the
said William saith he is worse and hurt damage to the value of twenty pounds sum. money of this
Government and thereupon he brings Suite & of Allen of Duke Georges depts in Dock Road

And the said John Olandman by George Dashed his attorney Cometh and defendeth the force
and Injury aforesaid and prayeth Leave to Impure hereunto until the next Court and he hath it and
the same day is given to the aforesaid William Whittington also

At which said next Court to wit the Eighteenth day of August and Dowd One thousand Seven
hundred & twenty four came again as were the aforesaid William Whittington as the aforesaid John Olandman
by their attorneys aforesaid and thereupon the said John Olandman by his said attorney prayed further
Leave to Impure hereunto until the next Court ^{and he hath it} and the same day is given to the aforesaid William
Whittington also
