

Sgt. Benjamin Wailes <sup>of Bath Court</sup> --- 1725 --- 111 -  
Memorandum the 2d by Lewis Hale his attorney Subscribed in his will of  
Surfacing against the debt, the sum whereof follows in these words, and  
Henry Williams Clugan Somerset's Plaintiff Absolute Lord & Proprietor of the Province of  
and Tho. Taylor Maryland & Avalon Lord Baron of Baltimore & to the Sheriffs of  
Somerset County Greeting Whereas a certain Benj: Wailes of Somerset County deceased died Satis-  
ably in our County Court of Somerset here (Court) on the Seventeenth Day of March anno Domini  
MDCCLXVII Seven hundred and Sixty seven years before the birth of Christ and was  
thereafter Seven hundred and Sixty three before the birth of Christ and was buried in the church of  
the said County at Bridgwater & by Consideration of said Court obtained his Execution  
of a certain Judgment against a certain Henry Williams of Steyning parish in the County of Sussex  
Alice his wife admt of a certain Thos: Taylor late of Somerset County deceased a widow of the sum of eight  
hundred & Eighty five pounds of to the aforesaid debt together with the sum of two hundred & fifteen  
pounds of costs of suit & also the sum of two hundred & Sixty one pounds of to the aforesaid Court here  
adjudged unto the said Benj: Wailes for his costs of Suit sustained by execution of sale of Execu-  
tion of the Judgment of all such sums as to be recovered on the Goods & Chattels which were of the  
aforesaid Thos: Taylor at the time of his death & which to the hands of the aforesaid Henry Williams and  
Alice his wife admt as aforesaid should after same to be administered if found there in their hands they  
should leave whereof they are found or by the tenth & except whereof in our said Court remaining  
before the Justice thereof it may appear otherwise the Judgment aforesaid remaneth  
unsatisfied as by the Insufficiency of the said Benj: Wailes we have learned, & because we are  
willing that these things which in our said County Court are lightly done should be to advice  
remedied we command you that by good Lawfull men of your County with you make known  
unto the said Henry Williams & Alice his wife that they be & appear before our said Justices  
at our County Court of Somerset to be held at Bridgwater the third last day of March  
next to shew cause if any thing for themselves they have or know to say why the aforesaid Benjamin  
Wailes his Executors of the Judgment aforesaid against them the said Henry Williams & Alice his wife  
admit as according to the force of the recovery as he ought not to have it shall seem  
mete & manner to do & receive what our said Court shall consider of & leave you there to hear  
the names of those by whom you make the same known & this witness Samuel Heywood  
Chief Justice of our said Court the 19<sup>th</sup> Day of November in the 10<sup>th</sup> year of our Sovereign  
King George II

At which said third Tuesday of March to wit the fifteenth day of the month of March and anno Domini One thousand  
Seven hundred and twenty five being the day of the return of the said Writ annexed the said Benjamin Wailes  
by his attorney aforesaid the Sheriff of Somerset County to whom the foregoing Writ was directed did
