Domⁱ One Thousand Seven hundred and twenty six came into Somerset County Court before
Marlido Tiv^r Gale Clerk of the Indentures for the said County and for the Right hand to the said proprie-
tary gave the Court here to understand and be informed that Marlido Tiv^r late of Somerset County Squinter
the tenth day of July anno Domⁱ One thousand Seven hundred and twenty five at the County and within the
Jurisdiction of this Court did suffer herself to be begott with Child by a negroe against the Peace of the King
to the said Proprietary his good Rule and Government and also against the form of the act of Assembly
in such case made and provided &c. Whereof the said Lewin for the said Proprietary prayd Dismissal
of the suit here &c. - Gale Esq^r J^d of S^r County

Thereupon command was given to the Sheriff of Somerset County that he shou^d take the said
Marlido Tiv^r late of Somerset County Squinter if he to answer her and afterwards in the same Court
comes the said Marlido Tiv^r in custody of the Sheriff of Somerset County and being by the Sheriff putt
to the Bar is thereupon instantly demanded how she would acquit herself of the premises and says
that of the Premises afo^d above Imposed upon her she is no way guilty thereof, and therefore for cresse
she putt herself upon the County and Lewin Gale his Lordsh^gs attorney who for his said Lordsh^g in
his behalfe prosecutes likewise

Thereupon command is given to the Sheriff of Somerset County that immediately he cause
to come before twelve men by whom he who neither he to recognize her because as well he of which said Person
the said Sheriff to will Francis Allen Gentle makes Return that he hath here ready twelve men by his que-
stion he was commanded and the Jurors thereto Impannelled being called came to w^t - William Gane

Wherefore it is considered by the Justice here that the said Marlido Tiv^r be sold to the highest
bidder for Seven Years for the use of the County, and likewise the Child so as afo^d begott of the said Marlido
Tiv^r sold he shall arrive to thirty one years of age for the use afo^d - Thereupon a certain John
Tule of Somerset County present in Court by buys the said Marlido Tiv^r of the Justice for Seven Years
and her Child till she arrives to thirty one. the said Marlido Tiv^r and Child to serve the said Jas
Tule his heirs or assigns the full term afo^d. In consideration of the Service afo^d the said
John Tule is to pay to and for use of Somerset County the sum of two thousand five hundred and
