The Petition and Being Read and heard and the Premises Considered; the Said Roger Woolford ^{would} not accept of the Estate of the afo Lewis Woolford Decd. that does belong to Martha and Mary Woolford his Orphans, upon Non Other terms than that the Estate personalle in Negro's &c should not be sold and that their Slaves should be preserved in the Best Manner for the Use of the Orphans afo &c —

Whereupon the Justices of Somerett in Court Sitting makes an Offer of the Estate of Lewis Woolford afo Decd. that does belong to the afo Orphans, ^{to severall persons} then present in the same Court, to be Guardian to the Orphans and their Estates afo, on the first terms provided by act of Assembly afo, ~~and~~ appears by the Seven Paragraph of the same act, but No Person would accept of the same or undertake as Guardians for the same Orphans and their Estates on those terms afo, by Law Provided for — Whereupon the same Justices of the Court afo did then committ the Estate Personalle of the said Orphans unto the care of the afo Roger Woolford, who is appointed by the same Court Guardian or trustee of the same, on the terms afo, that he offered to accept there of; as is mentioned in the same act of Assembly and Incident to the Seventh Paragraph afo &c.

Whereupon It is Ordered by the Court that the Said Roger Woolford give good Security to Comply with the Law in Relation to such Guardian or trustees for —

Thereupon the Said Roger Woolford together with Dennis Gale and Francis Allen his Security afo present in Court in their proper persons acknowledged themselves Joyfully and Severally to owe and Stand Fully Indebted unto the afo Martha and Mary Woolford Orphans as afo their Heirs or assignees in the sum offour hundred and Six pounds Current money to be Levied upon their bodys goods or Chattells Lands or tenements Joyfully and Severally for the Use of the afo Orphans their Heirs or assignees for —

In Case the Said Roger Woolford do ~~not~~ Sell and dispose, or suffer to be Sold or disposed the Original Stock of Slaves, and their Increases that belongs to the Orphans afo, and do not in the best manner preserve them for the Use of the said Orphans till they shall arrive at ~~full~~ full age as by Law in such Case provided Quinverted and appointed without intent to hinder their having their first Stock of Slaves made good to them, in number, Value, and ability of body if necessary &c and Likewise if he doth not Comply in Every Respect with the Law touching such
