There upon the aforesaid Isaiah Bredale present in Court acknowledged himself to owe and
stand duly indebted unto his Lordship the right honorable the Lord proprietary of this province
his heirs and Successors in the Sum of twenty pounds Sterl. to be levied upon his Body goods or
Chattel Lands or tenements for the Use of his said Lordship the Lord proprietary his heirs and
Successors. In Case he doth not make his personal appearance before the Justices of his said
Lordship's County Court of Somerset the third Tuesday of November Next to answer unto his Lord:
ship concerning his false banking of Bank aforesaid and to stand and abide the Judgment of the Court.
Whereupon and not to depart the same Court without Licence thereof
