been <sup>to</sup> ~~been~~ <sup>to</sup> same about two years, but Now is so Ill he cannot do anything whereby Earn his  
bread - Therefore prays he may be discharged from paying his Levies till he doth recover, if it shall please  
God to Restore him and as in duty Bound shall pray - Jonathan Bonds

The petition being read & heard - It is therefore Considered by the Court, that the said Jonathan  
Bonds be discharged from the paying of Levies for the Negro <sup>as</sup> ~~as~~ <sup>until</sup> such time as he shall be re-  
stored to his former State &c

John Walton son and Orphan of John Walton dec<sup>d</sup> being of full age to chose his Guardian. Comes into Court  
in his proper person, and prays that he may be admitted to chose a certain <sup>William</sup> Walton as his Guardian, which  
is granted him &c. Thereupon It is Ordered by the Court that the said William Walton take the Estate of  
the said John Walton Orphan of <sup>his</sup> ~~his~~ <sup>under</sup> his Care, both Real and Personall - and that Thomas Collins  
who hath the same now in possession, deliver the same unto the said William Walton Quietly and peace-  
ably, and that the said William Walton Comply with the Law in such Case made and provided &c

William Walton son and Orphan of John Walton being not of full age to chose his guardian as the Law  
directs - therefore a certain John Holland is appointed by the Court as Guardian to the said William  
Walton Orphan as <sup>as</sup> ~~as~~ <sup>until</sup> such time as the said William Walton shall attain to full age to chose  
the same - and further It is Ordered by the Court that the said John Holland take under his Care  
all the Estate of the said William Walton both Real and personall, and that a certain Thomas Collins  
~~who~~ <sup>now</sup> ~~hath~~ the same in possession deliver the same unto the said John Holland, and that he  
Comply with the Law as is directed in such Case <sup>and</sup> provided &c

Whereas a certain Jeffrey Long of Somerset County Gentle: being Obliged to Return a certain  
John Sailer to this County Court of Somerset, he being a servant Chimicall, to be combust to the County  
of Somerset two hundred and forty one pounds of tobacco which was paid for him &c

Now here at this day to wit the fifteenth day of June and down: One thousand seven hundred &  
twenty five since the said Jeffrey Long and delivers up the said John Sailer or ~~as~~ <sup>as</sup> ~~before~~ <sup>before</sup> said he was  
Obliged &c - Thereupon a certain William Matthews of Somerset County Esquire Comes into Court  
in his proper person and Confesseth Judgment unto the said County of Somerset for the said Sum of  
two hundred and forty one pounds of tobacco, so as <sup>as</sup> ~~as~~ <sup>is</sup> ~~is~~ <sup>paid</sup> by the County for the said John Sailer
