Issue to them as the Law directs &c

John Scott } To the worshipful Justices of Somerset County now in Court sitting - the humble Petition  
Pet<sup>n</sup> of John Scott humbly sheweth that your petitioner hath an negro man called Simon very  
old and scarcely able to work and Suddly with all so that his Labour will not feed him with necessary  
food and payment and your petitioner prays your worship that he may be tax free and your  
Petitioner as is duly bound & sheweth Every Day  
John Scott

The petition aforesaid being read and heard, and the premises considered - It is therefore Ordered  
by the Court that the said John Scott be discharged for the future, from paying of taxes, for the said  
Negro Simon, as by the petition aforesaid is granted &c

Robert Harris sued } UPON the Complaint of certain John Scarbrough of Somerset County Gent and  
& recognisance for good } foreman of the grand Inquest for this Court, <sup>June</sup> <sup>helden for the County of</sup> against aforesaid Robert Harris  
behaviour of the same County Gent, that he the said Robert Harris did violently force him-  
self into the Grand Jury room, amongst the Grand Jurors, and would not depart altho' the said  
Robert often requested by the aforesaid John Scarbrough, and the rest of his Brethren Jurymen of the  
Grand Inquest aforesaid - Whereupon It is Ordered by the Court that the Sher. of  
Somerset County goe immediately and bring the said Robert Harris into Court to answer &c - and  
afterwards in the said Court commit the said Robert Harris in custody of the Sher. and thereupon -  
the said Robert Harris being demanded why he intruded upon the Grand Jury, and forced himself  
amongst the same Jurors, and would not depart altho' often desired - the said Robert Harris  
had nothing to offer in his own defence that was Material &c

Wherefore it is considered by the Court, <sup>that the said Robert Harris</sup> be fined for the fact aforesaid to his Lordship the  
the said Proprietary the Sum of two hundred pounds of tobacco - and Likewise that he give Security  
for his good behaviour and appearance at next Court &c - Whereupon the said Robert Harris acknow-  
ledged himself to owe and stand Suddly Indebted unto his Lordship the Right honorable the Lord Propri-  
etary in the Sum of twenty pounds Sterl. to be Levied on his body goods or Chattels Land or Tenements  
for the use of his said Lordship his heirs and Successors In Case he doth not make his personal
