Therefore it is Considered by the Justices here the same day and year last mentioned that the said John Gowen Recover against the said Jacob Phillips as well the Sum of two pounds five Shillings and two pence Court money his damages and in form as Coufered as also the Sum of two hundred and thirty Nine pence of costs for his costs and charges by him about his suite in that part expended to the same John by the Court here of his assent adjudged and the said Plaintiff in mercy &c
