

whereupon the petition aforesaid being read and heard and all and singular the premises considered as well on the Part of the aforesaid Petitioner as on the part of the said Nathaniel Nicholson, the said Nathaniel Nicholson being present in Court could now ways make it appear, to the same Court, by what he holds, or doth deeme the same James Green as a servant &c.

Wherefore it is Ordered by the Court, that the said James Green from the Service of the aforesaid Nathaniel Nicholson be acquitt and goe hence free &c.

Whereas before this Court John Fawcett having turned the road by his quarter at Manocca and Capt John Jones and William Shoughton Esq being Requested to view the Road and make their Report to this Court - Whereupon In pursuance to the request the aforesaid John Jones & William Shoughton went on the same New road, and makes Report, as followeth, That the same New road is well paved, & made sufficient by ditching &c - Whereupon It is Ordered by the Court that the same New road remain and continue a main Road unalterable, for the use of the country.

Miles Sweeny { Capt. James Lindow comes into Court and exhibits an a/c against his Servant adjudged a man named Miles Sweeny, for Runaway time, & charge and trouble in Pursuite for Runaway time of the said Miles Sweeny, and in taking him up - and likewise the said Lindow made oath that the said Sweeny had absented out of his service ^{himself} ~~about~~ days, (and after the runaway time aforesaid, the said Lindow sold the said Sweeny to Capt Robert King) Whereupon the said Miles Sweeny is adjudged by the Court to serve his Master Robert King five days for every day he absented himself out of his service aforesaid which amounts to fifty five days, and likewise the said Miles Sweeny is adjudged to serve his said Master King forty two days being full Satisfaction for the sum of two hundred pounds of tobacco paid for taking him up and twenty Pounds for other charges the said Lindow was at in pursuit of the said Sweeny when runaway which Servitude in the whole doth amount to Ninety Seven days, all which Servitude to commence at the apprehension of the said Sweeny's ^{the said} adjudged time which is adjudged full Satisfaction for the Runaway time, & charge and trouble in taking up of the said Sweeny aforesaid &c

Upon the motion of Capt John Donelson adud. of Samuel Fox Esq. directed to leave the Negro's of the said Samuel Fox his service, he being desirous to send them back to Barbados from whence they came - which is granted & provided he send them away by Novem. Court next &c

Catrich Dennison a suspected Runaway being brought into Court, is Ordered to give security for his appearance at next Court - Whereupon a certain Thomas Ranchor of Somerset County, and present here in Court undertakes for the said Catrich Dennison and acknowledges
