

Beard, Peter Frazer, William Smith, William Laws, John Fleming, John Read, John Riggin, John Davis, William Bratton and George Taylor who being duly elected tried and sworn to say the truth in the premises upon their Oath do say that the afo<sup>d</sup> Anthony West is guilty of the Assault whereof the Stand<sup>d</sup> Indited - Therefore it is considered by the Court that the afo<sup>d</sup> Anthony West be taken to satisfy his Said Lordship the Lord Proprietor of his fine by Occasion of the assault afo<sup>d</sup>, which certain Anthony West then and there present in Court afo<sup>d</sup> prays that he may be admitted to make fine to his Lordship by Occasion of the premises afo<sup>d</sup>, and the same Anthony West is fined by the Justice, One hundred pounds of tobacco to the use of his Said Lordship &c. Whereupon the said Anthony West is ordered to give security for the fine afo<sup>d</sup> and the several Officers fees due by Occasion of the premises afo<sup>d</sup>, Whereupon a certain Thomas Hugg of Somerset County present here in Court undertakes for the said Anthony West to pay the fine afo<sup>d</sup> and all fees due by means of the premises in case the said Anthony West doth not pay the same &c.

Whereas a certain Daniel Travers being bound by Indentures unto Dennis Folio a certain Dennis Folio to learn the trade of blacksmith, with other coe  
nacts, as appears by <sup>the same</sup> Indentures between them made &c. the said Daniel Travers com  
into Court and makes complaint against his said Master Dennis Folio, that he did not comply with the  
said Indenture between them made which on his part ought to be performed, afterward in the same  
Court came as well the afo<sup>d</sup> Dennis Folio as the afo<sup>d</sup> Daniel Travers, and the Court having heard their  
several allegations & well on the part of the afo<sup>d</sup> Dennis Folio, & on the part of the said Daniel  
Travers, & also Inspected the Indenture afo<sup>d</sup> mentioned between them to be made &c. Whereupon  
it is Ordered by the Court that the afo<sup>d</sup> Daniel Travers return home to his said service, and that the  
afo<sup>d</sup> Dennis Folio give security in ten pounds Sterling with one Surety to comply with the Indan  
ture afo<sup>d</sup> on his part to be complied with &c.

Whereupon the afo<sup>d</sup> Dennis Folio present in Court with Patrick Kerrie his Surety  
acknowledged themselves indebted unto the afo<sup>d</sup> Daniel Travers in the sum of ten pounds Sterling  
separately good and Lawfull money of England on his body goods or chattels lands and ha  
ments Separately to be levied for the use of the said Daniel Travers his or a pigney, In  
case the said Dennis Folio do not comply with the Indenture between them made afo<sup>d</sup>, on  
his part to be complied with &c.
