

Read, Peter Fraser, William Smith, William Laws, John Fleming, <sup>John Farinero</sup> John Head Higgins, Jaques Riggan  
 John Davis, William Bratton and George Taylor who being duly elected tryed and sworn to say the  
 truth in the premises upon their Oath do say that the afd Anthony West is guilty of the Assault where-  
 of he stands Indicted - Therefore it is considered by the Court that the afd Anthony West be taken  
 to satisfy his said Lordship the Lord proprietary of his fine by occasion of the assault afd, which certain  
 Anthony West then and there present in Court afd prays that he may be admitted to make fine to his Lord-  
 ship by occasion of the premises afd, and the same Anthony West is fined by the Justices one  
 hundred pounds of tobacco to the use of his said Lordship &c. thereupon the said Anthony West  
 is ordered to give security for the fine afd and the severall Officers fees due by occasion of the  
 premises afd, thereupon a certain Thomas Hugg of Somerset County present here in Court undertakes  
 for the said Anthony West to pay the fine afd and all fees due by means of the premises in case  
 the said Anthony West doth not pay the same &c

 Dennis Folio } Whereas a certain Daniel Travers being bound by Indentures unto  
 a certain Dennis Folio to learn the trade of a blacksmith, with other con-  
 ditions, as appears by <sup>the same</sup> Indentures between them made &c. the said Daniel Travers comes  
 into Court and makes Complaint against his said Master Dennis Folio, that he did not comply with the  
 said Indenture between them made which on his part ought to be performed, afterwards in the same  
 Court came as well the afd Dennis Folio as the afd Daniel Travers, and the Court having heard their  
 severall allegations as well on the part of the afd Dennis Folio, as on the part of the said Daniel  
 Travers, as also inspected the Indenture afd mentioned between them to be made &c. Whereupon  
 it is ordered by the Court that the afd Daniel Travers return home to his said Service, and that the  
 afd Dennis Folio give Security in ten pounds Sterling with one Surety to comply with the Inden-  
 ture afd on his part to be complied with &c

Whereupon the afd Dennis Folio present in Court with Patrick Kerue his Security -  
 Acknowledged themselves Indebted unto the afd Daniel Travers in the sum of ten pounds Sterling  
 severally good and Lawfull money of England on their body's goods or Chattels Lands and Ten-  
 ements severally to be levied for the use of the said Daniel Travers here or a foreigner; In  
 case the said Dennis Folio do not comply with the Indentures between them made as afd, on  
 his part to be complied with &c
