Command was given to the Sher. of Somerset County that he should take Patrick Burn late of Somerset County Carpenter if he should be found in his Bailiwick and him should safe keep so that he might have his Body before the Justice, of his Lordships County Court of Somerset to be held at Bridgwater the third Tuesday of March then next to answer unto Robert Truman of a plea of trespass upon the Case and that thereof he should not fail <sup>as</sup> —

At which said third Tuesday of March <sup>to wit</sup> the fifteenth day of the same month and year One thousand seven hundred and twenty five came the said Robert Truman by Lewis Hale his attorney and the Sher. of Somerset County to whom the foregoing writ was directed Likewise came also and returned thereto to the court here endorsed in these words following ~~in the beginning of March~~ <sup>the Sher.</sup>

At the Said Patrick Burn by George Darshill his attorney came and defendant the force and injury where <sup>as</sup> and pray leave thereof to Judge hereunto until the next Court and he hath <sup>it</sup> the same day is given to the afo <sup>Court</sup> here also —

At which said next Court to wit the twenty first day of June and year One thousand seven hundred and twenty six came again as well the afo <sup>Court</sup> as the afo <sup>Deft</sup> by their attorneys afo <sup>and</sup> and the afo <sup>Deft</sup> by his said attorney pray further leave thereof to Judge hereunto until the next Court and he hath it and the same day is given to the afo <sup>Court</sup> here also —

At which said next Court to wit the sixteenth day of August and year One thousand eleven hundred and twenty six came again as well the afo <sup>Court</sup> as the afo <sup>Deft</sup> by their said attorney <sup>afo</sup> and the afo <sup>Deft</sup> by his said attorney pray further leave thereof to Judge hereunto until the next Court and he hath it and the same day is given to the afo <sup>Deft</sup> here also —

At which said next Court to wit the fifteenth day of November and year One thousand seven hundred and twenty six came again as well the afo <sup>Deft</sup> as the afo <sup>Patrick Burn</sup> by his attorney afo <sup>and</sup> and the afo <sup>Robert Truman</sup> came and there his writ afo <sup>against</sup> against the afo <sup>Patrick Burn</sup> did not prosecute with effect but voluntarily suffered his suit to be discontinued —

Therefore afterward <sup>vizt</sup> the same day and year by Discretion of the Justice, here were adjudged the sum of two hundred <sup>and</sup> Seven pounds of tobacco for his costs and charges by him about his defense in that part sustained according to the form of the Statute in such case were adequately made and provided and the afo <sup>Deft</sup> Robert Truman in mercy and that the afo <sup>Patrick Burn</sup> have thereof Recouer —
