

Novemb. Court - 1726 - 198

John Thomas Hugg of Somerset & James Smith late of Somerset County planter was attacked to
Lg. James Smith Answer unto Thomas Hugg of a plea of trespass upon his case &c

And whereupon the same Thomas Hugg by George Dashwood his attorney Complaints
that the afo James in the year of Our Lord One thousand seven hundred and twenty four at Steppney
Parish within the jurisdiction of this Court was indebted unto the same Thomas the sum of one
hundred pounds of tobacco and One Young Cow and Calf of five years Old not to exceed six years
old it being for above what the said Thomas at the present Justice and request of the said James
sold and delivered and the said James being indebted as afo for and in consideration afo at the
time and place afo did upon himselfe promise and to the said Thomas then and there did faithfully
promise that he and the hundred pounds of tobacco and One Young Cow and Calf of five years
old not to exceed six years Old he would well and truly pay when thereto requested and at the said
hundred pounds of tobacco part of the debt afo the said James hath paid and contented yett afo to
the residue being One Young Cow and Calf of five years Old not to exceed six years Old
according to his promise and assumption afo altho after thereto requested unto the said Thomas
he hath not paid nor in any wise contented but the same to pay hath refused and the debt before
laid damage of the said Thomas of twelve hundred pounds of tobacco and there of he bring
Sd George Dashwood his attorney Jno Doe K Rec

And the afo James Smith by Leon Hale his attorney Cometh and defendeth the force and injury
where up and pray leave to interpose hereunto unto the next Court and he hath it and the same
day is given to the afo Clerk here also

At which said next Court to wit the Sixteenth day of August anno Domini One thousand
Seven hundred and twenty six come again as well the afo Thomas as the afo James by their
attorneys afo and the said James by his said attorney pray further leave to interpose hereunto
unto the next Court and he hath it and the same day is given to the afo Clerk here also

At which said next Court to wit the fifteenth day of November anno Domini One thousand Seven
hundred and Twenty six come again as well the afo Clerk or the afo Debt by their attorneys
afo, and whereupon the said Clerk by his said attorney as before defendant the force and injury
where up and say he did not promise upon himself in manner and form as the afo against
him above hath complained and of his having himself against the Country, &c - And the afo
in like manner

Whereupon the afo James Relinquisheth
his Verification afo by him above alledged and says that he cannot gainsay but that he did promise
and upon himselfe himself in manner and form as the afo Plaintiff by declaring afo above supposed
wherefore the afo Thomas his damages by occasion of the non performance of the promise afo
assumed
