King by himselfe or his attorney appear and answer unto the said George Hutchins in a plea of the writ upon the case &c. according to Law and that by good and Lawfull men of your Bailiwick you make known unto the person, or persons, in whose hands you make the same attachment, that he she or they be and appear, before the Justices of Our said County Court to be held as afo, to shew cause if any ^{part} or they have why the same goods Chattells Rights or Credits, so attached in his her or their hands ought not to be condemned and Execution thereof had & made according to the form of the act of assembly in that case made & provided if to him her or them it shall seem meet and how you shall Execute this writ that you make known unto Our said Justices at the same day and place afo and have you then and there this Witness Samuel Hopkins Gent: Chief Justice of Our said County the 16th day of December in 5th year of Our Dominion & Command 1724 (Dorset) - Thomas Hayward Secy -

At which said third Tuesday of March to wit the sixteenth day of the same month and Dow. One thousand seven hundred and twenty four being the day of the Return of the said Writ Cometh the said George Hutchins by his attorney afo, and the Sherrif of Somerset County to whom the foregoing Writ was directed Likewise Cometh and maketh Return thereof to the Court here Endorsed in these words following vizt. By virtue of the within precept to me directed I have attached in the hands of Thomas Humphrey of the Sum of four pounds four Shillings and Seven pence half penny, and four hundred pence pounds of tobacco to be for William Ralph and Thomas Barimore, and Summed the said Thomas as Garnishee as by the said Writ I am Comanded - Joseph M^rester Sherrif

Whereupon the afo Thomas Humphrey's Garnishee of the afo William King at the Solemnly Called Cometh not but maketh default &c. nor doth any other person appear for him to shew cause to the contrary &c. - Whereupon the said George Hutchins by his attorney afo prayeth that upon giving security according to act of assembly that the money and Tobacco afo so as afo attached as of the Rights and Credits of the said William King may be condemned in the hands of the said Thomas Humphrey's towards Satisfying unto the said George Hutchins the Sum of four pounds four Shillings and Seven pence half Penny & four hundred pence pounds of tobacco as also the costs accruing upon the writ of attachment afo and that thereupon a certain Adam Hitch of Somerset County Clerk present here in Court undertakes for the said George Hutchins according to act of assembly that in case the said William King do at any time within a year and aday, appear and make all or any part of the Claim of the said George Hutchins against him appear to be satisfied or otherwise to have been undue before the saying of this attachment that then the said George Hutchins shall make Restitution to him the said William King of all or such part thereof as shall be made appear to be undue &c. or that he the said Adam Hitch will do it for him -
