I, the subscriber to a presentment hereunto annexed as James Rownd & Richd. Hudson
and John Full having been Qualifed & due notice given met on d^r. 2 tracts of Land mentioned
in the said Presentment the Eleventh day of June 1726 & in the presence of the Complainant came -
Capt. Willm. Hassell an Evidence aged 64 years d^r. 29th of May last past & being sworn & examined saith
that at a dead white Oak standing at the side of a glade near a large flourishing white Oak
being about 300 paces near S. E. from the house where Thomas Garrison now dwelleth & about
3000 years agoe the said Evidence had frequent Business downe at neck & then saw this dead
white Oak althoⁿ a young tree marked with a Surveyors mark enquiring what tree it was the geog.
he told him it was a dividing tree betweene the lands of Capt. Jackson & Robt. Johnson but know
not the name of the land it stands upon, also the said Capt. Hassell says that he knew of this
tree about 8 years agoe to Capt. Brattou & then it was a young tree not defaced -

The same day Mr. Mary Haughton appeared as deff^t in relation to d^r bounds of 2
tracts of land he had of land called Friends Donyall came W^m. Stevenson an Evidence
for the said deff^t aged 66 years or thereabouts & being sworn & examined saith that alwing
white Oak he very well remembers about 14 years agoe Capt. Brattou & d^r deponent was
