and Sarah Worrington orphans and their heirs Executors adwt^d or assignes, to the
whole payment were and truly to be made and performed we bind our selves and
other of our heirs Executors and adwt^d for the whole and in the whole jointly and
severally firmly by these presents sealed with our Seals and dated this 16 day of
November anno Domini 1726 —

The condition of the above Obligation
is such that if the above bound Benjamin Houston, Joseph Houston and Thomas
Selby or any or every of them their heirs Executors or adwt^d do well and truly pay
or cause to be paid unto the above named Rachell, Benjamin, Comfort and Sarah
Worrington their heirs Executors adwt^d or assignes the full and just sum of forty five
pounds fifteen Shillings and three pence per^r money being due to them then and
there^r adwt^d.
