to call the said Mary Woodcraft to appear before the Justices of said Court to give security &c Now
present this fifteenth day of June anno Domini One thousand seven hundred & twenty five Cometh the said
Mary Woodcraft - and forasmuch as the said Mary Woodcraft doth make it appear to the same
Court that she verilye no ways Obliged to give security according to Law whereupon the said Mary
Woodcraft is discharged paying her fee by reason of the premises aforesaid.
