of the return of the said Writt Comette of afo<sup>d</sup> Joseph M<sup>c</sup>Clester by his attorney  
the Sher<sup>r</sup> of Somersett County to whom the foregoing Writt was directed likewise  
Comette & Maketh return hereof to the Court here Endorsed in these  
words viz — Ex: Copus Deed delivered in time of me Brian Atchener

Whereupon the afo<sup>d</sup> Goyes Bashaw by George Darke his attorney Comette and defend-  
eth the fore and Injury which he and saith nothing in bar or avoidance of the action afo<sup>d</sup>  
of the afo<sup>d</sup> Joseph McClester by which the same Joseph Rememeth against afo<sup>d</sup> Goye,  
hereof undefended — Wherefore the afo<sup>d</sup> Joseph his damages by reason of the  
non performance of the promise and assumption afo<sup>d</sup> against the afo<sup>d</sup> Goye, ought to  
recover the same. Whereupon at the prayer of the same Joseph and by the Consent of the  
afo<sup>d</sup> Goyes the Justices here according to act of Assembly in such case made and pro-  
vided did after the Damages of the same party by reason of the non performance  
of the Promise and assumption afo<sup>d</sup> besides his costs and charges by him about his suit  
in that part expended to six hundred and two pounds aforesaid —

Therefore it is considered that the afo<sup>d</sup> Joseph McClester recover against  
the afo<sup>d</sup> Goye Bashaw as well the sum of Six hundred and two pounds aforesaid for damages  
as by the Justices afo<sup>d</sup> informed aforesaid as also the sum of Two hundred & Sixty four  
264. — — — pounds aforesaid for his costs and charges by him about his suit in that part  
expended by the same Joseph by default here aforesaid adjudged and doth defi-  
niitely pay

L. The service command was given to the Sheriff of Somersett County that he should  
call John Phillips late of Somersett County planter if he should be  
John Phillips. I found in his Bailiff's book and he should safe keep so that he might have  
his body before the Justice of his Lordship's County Court of Somersett to be held at  
Dividing Creek the third Tuesday of March then next to answer unto Mr. McClester of  
alleged trespass upon the said land that thereof he should not fail to —
