Thereupon the said William Langford appears and being sent to the Bar presentment read ^{not} pleads guilty and prays that it may be Enquired of by the Country and Jervis Gale for his said Lordship in this behalf presents likewise — Therefore Command is given to the Sherif of Somerset County that immediately he cause to come here to wit by whom & who neither & to leaguize & because as well & of which said precept the said Sherif to wit Joseph M^r Foster Gent, that he hath here ready to do as by his said precept he was commanded and the Jurors of that Jury therein Impanelled being called came to wit. Merrick Ellis, John Dennis Senr, John Fleming, William Bratton, Robert Mitchell, Robt Miles, Thomas Beal, Joseph Houston, Robert Collier, John Townsend, John Tull, Thomas Collins who being duly Electad byed ^{to say the truth in the precept} and sworn upon their Oath do say that the said William Langford is guilty of the Premises whereof the saids presented & —

Wherefore it is considered by the Court ^{here} that the said William Langford be fined to his Lordship the Lord Proprietary the Sum of thirty Shillings for the fact ^{to be appropriated toward the defraying the family charge}, which said fine of thirty Shillings by Capt W^m Blanner, unto Capt John Jones — thereupon the said W^m Langford is ordered by the Court to give Security for the paym^t of all the Officers fees due by Occasion of the premisses, Whereupon a certain Joseph Langford of Somerset County Clerk undertakes for the said W^m Langford to pay the Several Officers their fees due by Occasion of the premisses &c —
