At which said next Court to wit the third Tuesday of March being the twenty first day of the same month and Dow. one thousand seven hundred and twenty six, at dividing Creek in the County s<sup>d</sup> Cometh the s<sup>d</sup> Thomas Bredie by his attorney s<sup>d</sup>, and the Sher. to wit Francis Allen Gentleman likewise Cometh and makes the Return of a certain Inquisition taken before him at the house of M<sup>r</sup> James Martin at Snow hill Town in the County s<sup>d</sup> on the twenty eighth day of December one thousand seven hundred and twenty six by which it appears that the s<sup>d</sup> Thomas Bredie hath not sustained any damages by Quarion of the non performance of the promise and assumption s<sup>d</sup> of the s<sup>d</sup>.
