

Merrick Ellis of Somersett County Gent comes into Court in his proper person and makes Oath that his Servant woman Named Elizabeth White had absented herself out of his Service one hundred days, and pray the same Court that she may be adjudged to serve him for the same Runaway time according to act of Assembly in such Case made and provided, whereupon the premises by the Court being considered, It is therefore ordered and adjudged by the Court that the said Elizabeth White serve her said Master Merrick Ellis the full time of two whole Years and a halfe, to Commence at the Expiration of her now Servitude; the said two Year and a halfe Service being by the Court adjudged free of all Satisfaction for all Runaway time and, Costs, Charges, and Troubles, in her Service and to have paid on and of the same &c

Thomas Covington appointed by the Court Overseer of the Road in Wickersburg hundred in the stead of Thomas Humphreys, the said Thomas Covington to Clear a Road from the Cypress bridge to Spring Hill Crossings according to the direction of J. Sadwell and Benjamin Handy of Somersett County Gent

Proprietary of the Province of Maryland &c upon their Oath do present that Aaron Jordue late of Coventry parish in County of the Sixteen the day of November and one thousand seven hundred and Twenty six at the place and in the County and with force and arms in and upon a certain Peter Fitzgerald in the peace of God &c being did make an assault and affray and him the said Peter Fitzgerald then and there with force and arms did beat wound and Evill in what so that he did Dispar of his life and other harms unto him did to the great Damage of the said Peter Fitzgerald and against the peace &c

Thereupon Command was given to the Sheriff of Somersett County that he should take the said Aaron Jordue if he to answer &c and afterwards in the same Court came the said Aaron Jordue and being by the Sheriff set to the Bar & thereupon Instantly demanded how he would acquit himself of the premises and says that of the premises and he is guilty thereof and puts himself upon the favour of the Court and is willing to pay his fine for the fact of

Therefore it is considered by the Court that the said Aaron Jordue be taken to satisfy the said Proprietary of his fine by Caution of the Sheriff and assault and; and the fine of the same Aaron Jordue is by the Justice taxed to Six pence, to the use of his said Lordship whereupon the said Aaron is discharged paying the fine and the several Officers their fees due by Caution of &c
