The records & proceedings thereof in our Court before our Justices at Dividing  
Creek now remaining Manifestly appeareth & afterwards the said <sup>Wm</sup> at Soudwell  
County made his testament & last will in writing & constituted J<sup>d</sup>. Blizard  
of his testament & afterwards there died <sup>after</sup> whose death the said J<sup>d</sup>. Blizard  
said the Execution of his testament & upon himselfe took & of same testament  
had in Lawfull form good as on the part of the said Tho: Fletcher in our  
Court before us we have received Nevertheless Execution of his Judgmt & as  
yett remaineth to be done & because we are willing if those things which in  
our Court are lightfully acted should be duly executed. we command  
you if by honest & Lawfull men of your Bailly which you make known  
unto the said J<sup>d</sup>. Blizard if he be, before our Justices of our County Court of  
Soudwell to be held at Dividing Creek the third Tuesday of June next to show  
if any for himselfe he hath or to say knoweth wherefore the said Tho: Fletcher  
his Execution of the goods & Chattels which were of the said W<sup>m</sup> Begger  
at the time of his death in the hands of the said J<sup>d</sup>. remaining to be administered  
he ought not to have according to the force & effect of recovery of  
if to him it seemeth expedient & have you there then the names of them  
by whom you make known unto him & this writt Witness

All which said third Tuesday of June to witt the twentyeth day of the  
same Month anno domini one thousand seven hundred & twenty seven being  
the day of the return of the said writt Cometh the said Tho: Fletcher by his atty  
of the County of Soudwell to whose house the foregoing writt was directed  
like wife Cometh & maketh return thereof to the Court here endorsed in  
these words following Viz: — Made known to Francis Allen Sheriff

And the said Thomas Fletcher by Lewis Gale his attorney pray that the said John Blizard &c.  
as atty to his writt may answer. but the said John Blizard <sup>being lawfully called</sup> at the <sup>to before warned</sup> <sup>some</sup>  
not but makes default & —

Therefore it is considered by the Court here that the said Thomas Fletcher have his Execution of  
the said John Blizard Executor of the said William Begger of three thousand ~~hundred~~ and fifty  
One pounds of tobacco his damages & as also three hundred and Eighty Eight  
pounds of tobacco to the same Thomas by the Court here adjudged according to the form of the statute  
therof lately made and provided for his Cost and damages Sustained by Ousion of Delay of Execution  
of the damages & of the goods and Chattels which were of the said William Begger at the time of his  
death remaining in the hands of the said J<sup>d</sup>. Blizard to be administered if so much in his hands he hath  
and if so much in his hands he hath not than the Cost & Last mentioned to be levied of the  
proper goods and Chattels of the said J<sup>d</sup>. Blizard &c
