Command was given to the Sheriff of Somerset County that he shall take Ebenezer Cook Late of Somerset County Gentleman if he should be found in his County, and him should safe keep so that he might have his Body before the Justices of his Lordships County Court of Somerset to be held at Dividing Creek the third Tuesday of June next to answer unto Joseph Lemberton of a plea of trespass upon the said Mr. Cook and that there off he should not fail to —

And the said Joseph Lemberton complained against the said Ebenezer Cook in the place and as followeth vid.

Mr. Cook you stand justly indebted unto me in the quantity of two hundred and fifty pounds of tobacco, and unless you appear at the next Court to be held for Somerset County at Dividing Creek the third Tuesday of June instant I shall sue for attachment against your effects if any to be found in said County — June 19. 1727

At which said third Tuesday of June to wit the twentieth Day of the same month and anno Domini One thousand Seven hundred and twenty Seven being the day of the return of the said Writ Comette the said Joseph Lemberton in his proper person and the friend of Somerset County to whom the writt is —
The same action was directed likewise Comette and made to Return there off to the Court here endorced in these words following vid — Non est inventus, first note last of me Francis Allen Esq —

And the said Joseph Lemberton in his proper person prayeth that forasmuch as he hath Complied with the Law in order to an attachment he may have judgment against the said Ebenezer Cook for his damages and by way of attachment according to act of assembly No 10 whereupon for that it seems to the Court here that the said Joseph Lemberton hath Complied with the Law as alledged vid —

Therefore it is Considered by the Justices here the twentieth Day of June and anno Domini Seven hundred and twenty Seven that the said Joseph Lemberton recover against the said Ebenezer Cook as well the sum of two hundred and fifty pounds of tobacco his damages and all costs and charges by the said party laid out and expended about his suit by way of attachment against the goods chattels and debts of the said Ebenezer Cook according to act of assembly in full sum made and recovered vid —
