Jno. Burnall of Synagucton appointed Overseer for the Sea side, for the ensuing year &c.

Ordered by the Court that Thomas Simon Son of Edward Simon of Jygini Ramoni with Jid Collins for till he shall arrive to full age, to serve his Guardian &c.

Mary Goge & Jno. Burnall } Mary Goge with John Burnall her Security both present in Court. Security to Samuel Goge } acknowledge themselves to owe and stand Justly Indebted unto Samuel Goge in the Sum of ~~two~~ hundred & fifty three pounds and money to be levied upon

their bodies Goods or Estates, Lands or tenements for the use of the said Samuel Goge Joyfully and Severally to be levied. In case the said Mary Goge do not pay and satisfy unto the said Samuel Goge the Sum of One hundred and twenty Six pounds ten Shillings according to appraisment when he shall attain to full years, there being so much due from his said fathers Estate &c.
