Maddox in thirty pounds severally on their Body, good, or Chattells liquid, or Tenuements for the use of his said Lordship the Lord Proprietary his hours and Successors In case the said Alexander Maddox do not make his personal appearance before the Justices of his Lordships County Court of Somerset at Dividing Creek the third Tuesday of March next to answer unto his said Lordship concerning the premises & to stand and abide the Judgment of the Court thereupon and not to depart the same Court without License thereof &

Sarah Hogg and Eliz^w More being bound by Recognizance for their appearance this Court to give Evidence against John Lathbury, appears and are accordingly discharged &

John Caldwell Jnd^d and Thomas Caldwell being bound by the Court for their good behavior in appearance at this Court toward the Indians & appears are discharged &

Thos. Simmon^s memorand^m the 9th by George Darrell his attorney sued out his Lordship, with of Surefaire against the doff. the tenor whereof followeth in these words, bid. Somerset to Charles absolute Lord and Proprietary of the Province of Maryland & To the Sher^t. of Somerset County greeting Whereas after certain Thomas Simmon^s Sately, in Our County Court of Somerset to wit the twentieth Day of August in the eighth Year of Our Dominion & anno Domini One Thousand Seven Hundred Twenty four before the worshipfull Charles Ballard and his associates then Justices of Our Said Court at Dividing Creek, and by consideration of Our Said Court Recovered against a certain Thos. Layton of Syney Parish in Somerset County Planter as well the sum of five hundred pounds of Tobacco and fifteen bushells of Indian corn certain Damages as also the sum of two thousand forty pounds of Tobacco for his coste charges by him about his suit in this Behalf laid out & expended Whereof he is Comit as by the Record & Processe of in Our Said Court Remaining Manifestly appears & for as much as question remaineth hereupon as yet to be done (as by the Insinuation of the said Thomas Simmon^s we have w^t) and because we will of those things which in Our Said Court are Rightly done & Acknowledged Should be brought to a due Execution we command you that you make known unto the said John Layton that he be appear before the Justices of Our County Court to be held at Dividing Creek in Somerset County and the Third Tuesday of November next to shew cause if any for himself he hath or knoweth to say why the said Thomas Simmon^s his Execution
