 Robert Givans of Somerset County aged about fifty five years  
 Sworn and Examined on the part of the said William Alexander Saith as followeth viz<sup>t</sup>  
 That about twenty five years agoe by Order of George Godard Esq<sup>r</sup> Sale of the County of Tees. the  
 Deponent Layed off a tract of Land (belonging to the D. George (called Wallace) fifty acres for  
 Captain Griffing Jones & Mary his wife one of the Daughters of the same George the first Bou-  
 -nder of which D<sup>y</sup> fifty acres was a Stake standing near to a marked Oak which stood about  
 forty yards to the westward of the South End of a Lane which is now between the fence of the  
 Land of Mr. Alexander Adams & the fence of William Alexander & further Saith Not  
 Esq<sup>r</sup> Simon of Somerset County aged about fifty three years Sworn & Examined on the part of  
 the said William Alexander Saith as followeth viz<sup>t</sup> That about twenty years ago the Deponent  
 cleared the roads about the head of Wincosomoo Creek under William Alexander & that he well remem-  
 -bers that the main Road from the mill at the Head of the said Creek down the D<sup>y</sup> Creek & also to  
 the head of Manscan Run about forty yards to the Westward of the fence which is on the west side  
 of the Lane that is between the Land of Alexander Adams & the Land of William Alexander & that  
 near the East side of the D<sup>y</sup> Road there was a Line of marked trees which the Deponent hath  
 been Creditably Informed was the Line that Divided George Godards Land from the Land  
 of Griffing Jones & Mary his wife and further Saith Not; George Godard of Somerset County  
 aged about thirty nine Sworn & Examined on behalf of Alexander Adams & William Alex-  
 -ander Deponent Saith viz<sup>t</sup> That about twenty years ago by order of his Deed. father George  
 Godard he marked a Spanish Oak standing on a point of an Island by the branch side of  
 Wincosomoo Creek a little below the mill for a third Bounder of that part of Appawell  
 Land called Munnouth that was taken out of Winsor for Griffing Jones & Mary his wife &  
 that the first bounder of that part of Munnouth which was taken out of Wallace Chase  
 stood within a yard or two of a Hickory marked with sixteen notches which stands near  
 the South End of a Lane that is between the fence of William Alexander & Alexander  
 Adams and further Saith Not; John Godard of Somerset County aged about thirty six  
 years Sworn & Examined on behalf of the Geo. Alexander Adams & William Alexander Depon-  
 -ent Saith viz<sup>t</sup> That the first Bounder of that part of Land called Mounmouth  
 which was taken out of a Tract of Land called Wallace Chase stood within a yard or two of  
 a Hickory marked with sixteen notches which stands near the South End of Lane which  
 divides the fence of the Geo. Alexander Adams from the fence of the Geo. Alexander &  
 further Saith Not — —

We the said Court in the Court afo<sup>r</sup> mentioned do hereby further certify that the within named Alexander  
 Adams and William Alexander at the taking the above depositions did agree that the Hickory afo<sup>r</sup> mentioned standing  
 at the south End of the Lane between the fence of the said Adams and W<sup>m</sup>. Alexander should be the first
