on behalf of a certain John Scarbrough of the County afo gentle in relation to the bounds of two  
Tracts of Land lying in the County afo on the Seabord side the one called Durham house the other  
Marduke we require you or any three or two of you, that at some time & place as to you or any three or two  
of you shall seem convenient you meet on the afo two Tracts of Land named afo and there cause to come  
before you or any three or two of you all such evidence as shall be to you or any three or two of you nominated  
by the said Complainant or Defendant of any and that you examine them upon their oaths all oaths to be  
by you or any three or two of you administered on the holy Evangelist of Almighty God, in the presence of  
the complainant or Defendant if any touching the truth or remembrance of there knowledge any  
thing that may relate to the cause afo, and that reducing the several Depositions interwritting  
you send the same together with this our Commission under your or any three or two of your hands  
to us to our County Court of Somerset with all convenient speed witness Samuel Hopkins Gent  
Chief Justice of our Said Court d<sup>r</sup>. 20 day of March in the tenth year of our Common<sup>r</sup> Ann Dom 1725-

On the back<sup>de</sup> of the foregoing Commission it was thus endorsed vizt Memorandum this day  
Iewitt the Thirtieth day of August anno Dom 1725. John Burnall, Johnson Hill and Fisher  
Walton persons Nominated in the willim Commission and made Oath on the holy Evangelist that  
they would truly and truly execute the same without Prejudice favour or affection to any person  
or persons whatsoever sworn before me — — — — — Samuel Hopkins — — — — —

Fisher Walton & William Lord or to any three or two of them to examine evidence on behalf of  
John Scarbrough in relation to two parts of or parcels of Land the one called Marduke the other  
Durham house we the subscribers have met on the Lands aforesaid to examine evidence as follows —  
W<sup>r</sup> William Whittington aged about forty two years being sworn on the holy Evangelist of Alm:  
ighty God saith that sometime in his father's life time upon some Discourse he had with his  
father about the Bounds or first Bounder of Marduke a tract of Land called Marduke then  
then belonging to W<sup>r</sup> Matthew Scarbrough his father told him that Dorman Partrick then one  
of the near Inhabitants told him of Mr. Scarbrough's first Bounder of Marduke stood on the  
left hand of the then road that leadeth to Boguterton some Distance beyond Middle bridge  
or Branch Capt. Nath<sup>r</sup> Hopkins aged about fifty one years being sworn on the holy Evangelist  
also declareth that upon some Discourse he heard between Capt. William Whittington and Mr. Math.
