

Novem. Court — 1725 — 81

Scarbrough about Sixteen years since about the Bounds of the Land and called in Merdike to Hear them say that the first Bounder was stoned a small space beyond the Middle Branch near the Old Road in or near where the first swampy ground is. Capt. Nath Hopkins being sworn also on the Holy Evang. S. Sayeth that about Twenty six years agoe the 2d March Scarbrough carried him unto a marked White Oak Tree stane Dying near unto a place called the Head of Bogert Norton Creek and told him that that tree was one of his Boundaries of that tract of Land called Durham house — Capt. Nathaniel Hopkins also Sayeth that about Fifty years since the 2d March Scarbrough also carried him with a certain Henry up unto a marked corner gun tree standing in the side of a swamp near unto a place where Dr. Henry then settled & dwelt & if he also ^{saw} followed a line of marked trees from Dr. P. gun downwards towards the sea side about halfe a mile being as he was informed by J. W. Scarbrough a line of marked trees of the Land called Durham house &c — William Richardson Sworn on the Holy Evang. S. Sayeth that some time after that John Porter purchased part of that tract of Land called Durham house he did say John Porter carried him w^t said William unto a corner marked white Oak tree standing ^{unto} a place called the Head of Bogert Norton Creek and told him that Mr. Scarbrough told him that that tree was one of his lower Boundaries &c — at the Request of John Scarbrough we further report that we Summoned Mr. William Whittington to give his Evidence in Relation to the bounds of the Land called Durham house so far as concerned the said Scarbrough part there of which Mr. Whittington utterly refused to doe but bid Mr. Scarbrough take his advantage against him & doe his worst with other words to the like purpose &c — The above Examination of Evidence with the Above Depositions was Taken this 30th of August anno Domini 1725 — At Bursall

Thomas Breerton or either of them or either of their heirs etc or adm^r doe well & truly pay or cause to be
paid unto the above said Thomas, Richard, Sarah, Matthew & Mary Goslee their heirs & adm^r or
assignees the full & just sum of twenty nine pounds two shillings & three pence being the just balance due
to them from their said fathers estate when they shall attain to full age according to act of Assembly to be
paid according to will of w^t Ted Heath the above obligation to be void otherwise to remain in full force & virtue
