Likewise it is ordered by the Court that the said Joseph Harrison <sup>give</sup> recognizance with  
 Security for his good behaviour toward a certain Robert West &  
 Thereupon the said Joseph Harrison together with William Young his Security present  
 in Court in their proper persons acknowledged themselves Indebted unto his Lordship the said  
 Proprietary his heirs and Successors in manner and form following vizt the said Joseph Harrison  
 William Young in the Sum of ten pounds Sterling Each good and Lawfull money of England to be  
 severally Levied upon their body, goods, or Chattells, Lands, or tenements for the Use of the said  
 said Proprietary his heirs and Successors In Case the said Joseph Harrison doe not be of the  
 good behaviour to all his Lordships Seign people and more Especially to the said Robert West  
 during the pleasure of the Court and - Afterwards at the prayer of Leonie Gale his Lordships  
 attorney and the said Joseph Harrison with his Security is discharged from the recognizance  
 and Thereupon at the prayer of the said Joseph Harrison he was ~~discharged~~ <sup>graced</sup> by  
 proclamation in usual form &

 Whereas a certain Thomas Travers being committed into the Custody of the Sherif  
 of Somerset County there to remain until he deliver himself by due Court of Law  
 he being charged with the feloniously stealing a Plate from his Mistress Mary Harri-  
 son & the said Thomas Travers appeared before Court in Custody of the  
 Sherif of Somerset County, thereupon it is ordered by the Court that the said Thomas Travers -  
 give Security to stand and abide the Judgment of the Court &

Thereupon a certain William Mathew of Somerset County Clerke Present here in Court  
 undertakes for the said Thomas Travers and acknowledged himself to owe and stand Justly  
 Indebted unto the Right honorable the Lord Proprietary of this province his heirs and Successors in ten  
 pounds Sterling to be Levied upon his body, goods, or Chattells, Lands, or tenements for the Use of his said  
 Lordship the Lord Proprietary his heirs and Successors. In Case the said Thomas Travers do not  
 stand and abide the Judgment of the Court and do not depart without License thereof &  
 Somerset. The Jurors for the Right honorable the Lord Proprietary of this province that now is  
 for the body of Somerset County upon their Oath do present that Thomas Travers late of  
 Somerset
