Eighty pounds to be paid to the said Southy when he should call him unto reguested And to the  
said Payment well and truly to be made did bind himself and his heire by the aforesaid writing  
Never the less the aforesaid William in his life time and the aforesaid Joseph the brother & heire of him the said  
William after the death of him the said William the aforesaid thereto Reguested the aforesaid Eighty pounds  
to him the said Southy as yet has not rendered but the same to him to render have denysed and

Southy his worse and hath damage to the value of Four pounds Current Money and there

And the aforesaid Joseph Summers brother and heire of the said William Summers deceased by George da-  
shill his attorney Comell and deputeth before and Injury when & and prayeth leave to Imparte  
hereunto unlesse the Next Court and he hath it and the same day is given to the aforesaid Southy Whitting-  
ton also — At which said next Court to witt the Seventeenth day of November and Anno  
One thousand Seven hundred and twenty four came againe as well the aforesaid Southy Whittington as the  
aforesaid Joseph Summers brother and heire aforesaid by their attorneys aforesaid and the said Joseph Summers  
by his said attorney prayed further leave to Imparte hereunto unlesse the next Court and he hath  
it and the same day is given to the aforesaid Southy Whittington also —

At which said next Court to witt the Sixteenth day of March and Anno One thousand Seven-  
hundred and twenty four came againe as well the aforesaid Southy Whittington as the aforesaid Joseph Summers  
brother and heire aforesaid by their attorneys aforesaid and therupon the said Joseph Summers by his said  
attorney as before defindeth the same and Injury wheng & and saith that he hath not any said or tenuously  
by descent or heire to the aforesaid William Summers in fee simple, nor had at the day of exhibiting the  
original writ aforesaid, nor ever afterward, & this he is ready to beseeche wherefore he prayeth Judgment if of  
the debt aforesaid of the aforesaid William by vertue of the aforesaid obligatory he ought to be charged
