Whereas aforesaid William White an Orphan had formerly made Choice of William Whittington of Somerset County Gent<sup>l</sup> as his guardian <sup>W<sup>d</sup></sup>, at which time the said William Whittington had given security to Comply with the Law in Relation to the guardianship of the said William White <sup>W<sup>d</sup></sup> —

Now Repeat this Day to wit the Eighteenth Day of June and Doid One thousand Seven hundred and twenty Eight Came here into Court the Security of the afo William Whittington vizt. Joseph M<sup>r</sup>ester and Hugh Porter of the County afo Gentlemen, and Pray that they may be discharged from being security for the said William Whittington as afo and further that he may be ordered to give new and better security to Comply with the guardianship as afo Whereupon the said William Whittington being Present here in Court in his proper person is ordered by the same Court, that August Court Next to be hold for the County afo at dividing Creek, to then and there give good and New Security — Such as may be Liking to the then Court, to Comply with the Law <sup>W<sup>d</sup></sup> —

PURSUANT to the act of assembly we the Subscribers being Nominated and appointed by James DASHUE to meet at the dwelling house of John Collins Guardian of to Thomas Shurman J<sup>nd</sup> and then and there did view the said dwelling house and plantation with an Orchard and do Estimate the said dwelling plantation with the appurtenances at the Annual Value of three hundred and Eighty two pounds of tobacco given under our hands and Seals this 15<sup>th</sup> Day of June 1728 —
