John Jones

Whereas the Commissary general hath transmitted into this Court the balance of the Estate of Jane Phillips dec'd wherein it is found that there is due to the Orphans of the said Jane Phillips dec'd. fifteen pounds Eight Shillings and two pence current money

Whereupon it is ordered by the Court that John Jones who was Executor of the said Jane Phillips give Security according to Law to pay the Orphans of the said Jane their Respective parts or Shares of the said Sum of fifteen pounds Eight Shillings and two pence according to Law, and the wife of the said dec'd when they shall arrive at full age to receive the same &c -

Thereupon the said John Jones present herein Court in his proper person with Wm. Strong: for his Security acknowledged themselves to owe and stand Indebted unto, Ann North the wife of Thomas North, Richard Phillips, Sarah Phillips, Eliz. Phillips, George Phillips, Jane Phillips, Dorothy Phillips and James Phillips Orphans of the said Jane Phillips dec'd. in the Sum of twenty six pounds sixteen Shillings and four pence current money to be levied of their bodies goods or Chattels Lands or Tenements Joyntly and severally for the Use of the said Orphans their heirs or assigns if default be made in the Condition hereunder written -

The Condition of the above Recognizance is Such that if the above John Jones his heirs or assigns do and shall well and truly pay unto Thomas North and Ann his wife, Richard Phillips, Sarah Phillips, Eliz. Phillips, George Phillips, Jane Phillips, Dorothy Phillips and James Phillips Orphans as and their heirs or assigns the Sum of fifteen pounds Eight Shillings and two pence when they shall arrive at full age to receive the same, according to Law and the said dec'd's will then the above Recognizance to be void and of none Effect otherwise to stand & Remain in full force and Virtue in Law &c -

Ordered by the Court that Geo: Lewis be Overseer of the Road, and his Labourers, Geo: Dashiell Overseer of the Road and his Labourers, and Mr James Shawbridge Overseer of the Road and his Labourers, Joyn and assist Mr Thomas Gillis and his Labourers; to clear & load from William Alexanders into the main Road by Richard Blunkell, and after the said Road is once cleared by the said Overseers, and their Labourers, The said Thomas Gillis and his Labourers to keep said Road well cleared according to Law, and that James Boge be added to the said Thomas Gillis as one of his Labourers to clear the Road as &c -

Upon the Petition of several the Inhabitants of Boguettenorth hundred against carrying a Road from Mad^m Hampton's plantation on the seaside according to a former Order of Court obtained for clearing the same &c. The Pet^r being read and heard and the premises considered, It is therefore ordered by the Court that Andrew Smith the Overseer of the same Road build & repair thereof, and further it is ordered by the Court that the same Road be not deemed as a family Road for the future &c
