shillings and six pence, according to law and appraisement when she shall arrive at full
age to receive the same then the above recognizance to be void and of None Effect —
Otherwise to remain in full force power and virtue &c —

Whereas there is an affray committed by and between Kipps Haven
Johnson, and a certain Noble Tule as by the testimony of several
worthy witnesses makes appear —

Whereupon it is ordered by the Court that the sd Kipps
Haven Johnson, and Noble Tule be brought immediately into Court to answer &c

And afterwards in the same Court the said Kipps Haven Johnson, and Noble Tule
being present, and their severate allegations being heard, and what was declared at the bar by
several witnesses, It is further ordered by the Court that the sd Kipps Haven Johnson &
Noble Tule give security for their good behaviour, and during the pleasure of the Court &c

Whereupon the sd Kipps Haven Johnson with Joseph M^r for his security both
present here in Court in their proper persons and acknowledged themselves to owe and stand indebted
unto the right honorable Charles absolute Lord and proprietor of the province of Maryland &c
in the sum of ten pounds Sterling good and lawful money of England, of their body goods or Chattels
Land or tenements severally to be made and levied, for the use of his said Lordship his heirs
and assigns if default be made in the condition here under written —

The condition of the above recognizance is such that if the above bound Kipps
Haven Johnson be of the good behavior to all his Lordship's Lige People during the pleasure
of the Court and then the above recognizance to be void otherwise &c

Afterwards the said Kipps Haven Johnson being present ^{here} in Court, is at his prayer discharged
from his recognizance, paying the fee for the same &c —

Likewise the said Noble Tule with George Tule for his security both present in Court
acknowledged themselves to owe and stand duly indebted unto his Lordship the right honorable
Charles absolute Lord and proprietor of Province of Maryland &c in the sum of ten pounds
Sterling
