of Comfort Gibbons - humbly Sheweth - That your petitioner whilst she was a minor through
the threats and proceedings of Thomas Barker was forced to sign an Instrument to serve him
till she should arrive at the age of twenty five years and by vertue of the said Instrument if
said Barker holds your petitioner, and also refuse to allow your petitioner anything for two years
service to him before the time of signing of said Instrument your petitioner therefore prays your
• tender Consideration of the premises, and that you will give such Relife in the affair as to your
worshgs shall seeme meete - and your petitioner as in duty bounde shall ever pray Comfort Gibbons

The afo^rd Thomas Barker being present here in Court, and the petition being read and heard and
all and Singular the premises, fully understood as well on the part of the afo^rd Thomas Barker
as on the Part of the afo^rd Petitioner, and what severall persons delivered at the Bar, upon oath
in Relation to the premises afo^rd. It is therefore Considered and Ordered by the Court that
the afo^rd Comfort Gibbons from her service to the afo^rd Thomas Barker be acquitt, and that the Indem-
nity of the afo^rd Comfort is adjudged by the Court ^{vaine} not good &c

~~William White orphan off Stephen White ded came into Court, and made complaint against
his guardian William Whittington, that his said Guardian doth not give him Learning according
to the Interest of his Estate, and Likewise prays that the said William Whittington may
be Ordered to give New and Better Security than before given to Conform with the Law in Relation
to guardians &c~~

Whereupon it is ordered by the Court that the afo^rd County of Somerset
the afo^rd Wm Whittington so that he be and appear before the Justice of his Lordships County
Court of Somerset now sitting at Bridgwater to answer the complaint afo^rd

And afterwards in the same Court came the said William Whittington in his own proper per-
son Likewise the said William White present here in Court, Whereupon the said William Whittington
is Ordered to put the afo^rd Wm White to School and give him Education according to the
Interest of his Estate, and Likewise to give new and Better Security to Conform with the Law
in Relation to guardians &c

Whereupon the afo^rd William Whittington promised to putt the same William White
immediately to School, and keep him at the same, and likewise by August Court next to
procure such Security as may be Liking to the Court to Conform with the Law as afo^rd

Ordered by the Court that John Barker Sen^r pay unto John Barker Jun^r the sum of three hundred pounds
of tobacco being due unto him for his attendance ten days, for the said John Barker Jun^r as Evidence against
Isaac Ragoon he having made oath to the same &c
