Seven hundred and Twenty Eight Come the said ~~stet~~. and makes Return that he hath here ready twelve shillings by his said Brevept he was Commaunded and now hereafterwards to wit the same day and Year being as was the said Catherine Dace by her attorney and as the said George Dace who for his said Lordship in this behalf Brevept, and the Juries of that Jury therein Impannelled being called likewise came to wit Thomas Green, Lewis Disharoon, Dr Townesend Indr, John White Bromake, Thomas Humphry, Dr Heman, Dr Shanksley, John Broughton, Johnson Kie, James Roward, Stephen Walton, John Roach, who being duly asked tried and sworn to say the truth in the premises upon their Oath do say that the said Catherine Dace is not guilty of the Brevept as by the Brevept above said, is upon her Imposed.

Wherefore it is Considered by the Dishes here that the said Catherine Dace of the Brevept and be acquitt and goe thereof without day. Thereupon the said Catherine Dace is ordered to give security for the several Officers their fees due by Brevept of the premises and but for want thereof the said Catherine Dace is Committed into the Custody of the Sher. of Somerset County there to remain till the said stet. being present heren Court takes Charge of the said Catherine Dace accordingly, afterwards in the same Court Comr the Nicholas Ready and Richard Dukes, both of Somerset County Banters and undertakes for the said Catherine Dace to pay the several Officers their fees due by Brevept of the premises and as —

His Lordship - Daniel Corbitt appears according to his Recognizance Entered into for his appearance and good behaviour toward all his Lordship's good ^{people} and Especially toward a certain Eli^o Rough, and appearance at this Court to answer the.

Now hereat this day to wit the twentieth day of August and Mond. One thousand seven hundred and twenty Eight Come heren Court the said Daniel Corbitt and prays that his appearance may be Recorded to save himselfe and security from a certain Recognizance of bail Entered into as above said, whereupon the said Daniel Corbitt's appearance is Recorded. and he and his security accordingly discharged.

Thereupon it is ordered by the Court that the said Daniel Corbitt give new security for his good behaviour toward the said Eli^o Rough; and not for to Inter marry with a certain Dorothy Rough, during his servitude with a certain Thomas Bashaw —

Whereupon ^{the said} Thomas Bashaw present here in Court undertakes for the said Daniel Corbitt and acknowledged himselfe to owe and stand Justly Indebted unto his Lordship the Right Honble the Lord Proprietary of the Province of Maryland in the sum of fifty pounds Sterling good and Lawfull money of England to be levied upon his goods or Chattels Lands or tenements for the use of his said Lordship the Lord Proprietary his heirs and successors if default be made in the condition hereunder written

The condition of the above Recognizance is such that if the above bounden Daniel Corbitt be of the good behaviour to all his said Lordship's free People during his servitude, to the said Thomas Bashaw, and more Especially toward the said Eli^o Rough, and in the mean time do not Inter marry with the said Dorothy Rough then the above Recognizance to be void and of no effect otherwise the
