Command was given unto the Sheriff of Somerset County that of the goods and Chattels which were of Thomas Gray late of Somerset County planter being in his Bailiwick he should make as well a certain debt of twelve hundred pounds, of tobacco and ruggatt Coat and pair of leather britches which William Green in his Lordships County court of Somerset recovered against him as four hundred and seventy six pounds of tobacco which to the same William in the same Court before the Justice there of were adjudged for his damages which he had by reason of the detaining of that same debt, and when he had it same so made or any part thereof the same safe keep so that he might have the same before the Justice of his Lordships County Court of Somerset to be hold at Dividing Creek the third Tuesday of June then next, to satisfy the said William of his debt and damage, and that thereof he should not fail to
