To one Kitchen 20 foot Long & 10 foot wide all good
To one Milk House 10 foot Square pretty old
To one New Barn 30 foot Long & 20 wide at one foot plank floor at the End
with a shed 18 foot Long & 7 foot wide New, To one old Oven with an Indifferant
Good House over it & To one Garden with old fence Round it, To one apple
Orchard, To one peach Orchard, To one quinch Orchard, To one Nursery of apple trees,
To 243 pannels of old fence round both Ends gone Side of the Orchard Logg to a
Gammel, To 180 pannels of old fence pretty good Round the quinch Orchard and
Nursery, To 161 pannels of good old fence 10 Logg high round one side of the fence
field, To 164 pannels of Sedge to Both Ends of the Pasture Logg High

We do value the abovesaid Plantation to be worth three hundred Pounds per Year

long and 15 foot wide clauched above & Below New Double covered Battened with

To 165 pannels of fence Round up House and Orchard & Logg to a gammel pretty
good in the Orchard containing 55 apple trees To 54 pannels of fence across
a pointe of Woods into a beaver Damm full Logg to a gammel almost New

sue to my Hand this 22 day of August anno domini 1728 — J. Scott

There are to Certifie that this day to wit the 26 of June anno domini
Seventeen hundred twenty eight Wm West as Deputy Coroner came before me & Subscri-
ber one of his Lordships & Lord Proprietors Justices of the peace for the
Cty of Somersett & took the several Oaths to the Government as appointed by
Act of Assembly & also Subscribed the Oath of abjuration and also took
an Oath well & truly to execute office of Deputy Coroner for Somersett County

Command was given to the Sherif of Somersett County that he should satisfy
John Evans late of Somersett County Glouster if he should be found
in his bailey wood and him should safe keep so that he might have his body
before the Justice of his Lordships County Court of Somersett the third day of August then
next to satisfy unto John Rider two pounds twelve shillings and six pence farthing per annum
and three hundred and two pounds of late which to the said Rider in the same Court at divers
to be paid at divers times
times
