Cloath, and likewise find and provide for his said Servant during his Servitude meat drink wash
ing Loging and Cloathing sufficient for such a servant to have & wear ~~as~~

Whereupon it is Ordered by the Court that the said Mathew Hopkins give Security
to comply with Covenants afo^d, and that John Scarbrough deliver up unto the said Mathew Hopkins
all the Estate of the afo^d Harrison Ayres that he hath in his hands, let it be of what Kind soever, and
further it is Ordered that the said Mathew Hopkins take the said Estate into his care, and the same
redeliver unto the afo^d Harrison Ayres when he shall arrive at full age to receive the same ~~as~~

Whereupon the afo^d Mathew Hopkins with Johnson Hill his Securitie to the
present present Court in their presence persons acknowledged themselves to owe and standantly
indebted unto the afo^d Harrison Ayres in the sum of twenty pounds sterl. good and lawfull of
England of their goods, and Chattells Land, and tenementes severally to be made and levied for the
use of the afo^d Harrison Ayres his heire and assigns if default be made in the condition hereunder
written -

The Condition of the above Recognition is such that if the above bound Mathew
Hopkins do and shall well and truly leare the afo^d Harrison Ayres the hinde of a wheelwright and
Read well in the bible, and write and cypher as far as the rule of thre during his servitude afo^d

Nailler to serve her said Mistris the full term of nine afo^d, in all such lawfull Service as she
shall employ her in or about ~~as~~ In consideration of which Servitude heretofore the afo^d

Mary Nicholson undertakes, for to leare the said Lettice Nailler to Knitt, sew and Spine, and other
housewifery, and likewise find and provide for her ^{said service} meat drink washing Loging and Cloathing more
than her to have and wear during her servitude afo^d ~~as~~

Sib^e anegro girl of Edmond Hough is adjudged by the Court to be twelve years of age ~~as~~

Sep^e anegro boy of Edmond Hough is adjudged to be of the age of eight years ~~as~~

Cytron anegro boy of Samuel Hopkins is found to be of the age of ten years ~~as~~

Whereas a certain Mathew Ayres son of Henry Ayres de^d an orphan being foolish and had
no person to take care of him ~~as~~. Wherefore it is Ordered by the Court that John Scarbrough take
the said Mathew Ayres and his estate into his care, and find and provide for him such Necessaries as
is sufficient for him to have and wear ~~as~~
