The Law in every respect in relation to guardians, And further it is ordered by the Court that the aforesd William Biger take all the estate of the said Henry Ackworth into his hands both lease and personal, and that Thomas Ackworth and Charles Ackworth who were possess with the Estate of the aforesd Henry Ackworth deliver uppon unto the aforesd Guardian quietly and peaceably, and that the same William Biger give good security to comply with the law in Relation to guardians &c —

Whereupon the aforesd William Biger with George Darville of Somerset County Gent:

his security both present here in Court in their proper persons acknowledged themselves to owe & stand truly indebted unto the aforesd Henry Ackworth in the sum of one hundred pounds good and Lawfull money of England, of their goods and Chattels Lands or tenements segerately to be made and levied for the use of the aforesd Henry Ackworth his heirs or assigns if default be made in the condition here under written. —

The condition of the above Recognition is such that if the above bound William Biger do and shall well and truly in every respect comply with the law in Relation to the guardianship aforesd, and deliver uppon unto the aforesd Henry Ackworth quietly and Peaceably when he shall ~~one~~ arrive at full age to receive the same all his Estate that he hath in his hands both lease and personal, &c then the above Recognition to be void and of no Effect otherwise to remain in full force & virtue &c —

John Abbott John Abbott son of John Abbott deceased is bound by the Court of his Son bound to goe out unto Eliz^e Nicholson until he arrives to the age of twenty one

Eliz^e Nicholson years he being eighteen years of age next January, the said John Abbott

to serve his said Master the full term of time aforesd in such Lawfull Service as the said Master may have in and about during the term aforesd. In consideration of which Servitude the aforesd Eliz^e Nicholson promises to learn the aforesd apprenticeship during his servitude the trade of a Shoemaker, and to read well in the Bible, and at the Expiration of his servitude to give him a new suit of Cloathes, and likewise find and provide for her said Servant sufficient meat drink washing lodging and clothing mete for such an apprentice to have and wear during the term aforesd —

Whereupon it is Ordered by the Court that the aforesd Eliz^e Nicholson give good security for to comply with the covenants aforesd — Whereupon the aforesd Eliz^e Nicholson, with William McGannery her security before present before Court acknowledged themselves to owe and Stand truly indebted unto the aforesd John Abbott in the sum of twenty pounds Sterling good and Lawfull money of England of their goods & Chattels Lands or tenements segerately to be made and levied for the use of the aforesd John Abbott his heirs or assigns if default be made in the condition hereunder written.

The Condition of the above Recognition is such that if the above Eliz^e Nicholson do well and truly learn the aforesd Abbott during his servitude the trade of a Shoemaker and to read well in the Bible, and find & provide for her said apprentice sufficient meat drink washing lodging and clothing mete for such an apprentice to have & wear during his servitude aforesd, and at the Expiration thereof give her a new suit of Cloathes. Then the above Recognition to be void otherwise &c —
