Whereupon the sd James Houston with John Brittingham and Isaac Wheeler his Security all present here in Court in their proper persons acknowledged themselves to owe and stand Justly Indebted unto the sd Lewis Bowe in the Sum of One hundred pounds Current money good and lawfull money of Mansland of their goods and Chattells Lands and tenements for the use of the sd Lewis Bowe his heirs or assigns severally to be made and Levied if default be made in the Condition here under written.

The Condition of the above Recognizance is such that if the above bound James Houston do and shall, well and truly comply with the law in every respect in Relation to the garden ship sd, and Likewise quietly and peaceably deliver up unto the sd Lewis Bowe all his Estate that he hath in his hands both Reale and Personall when he shall arrive at full age to Receive the same then the above Recognizance to be void and of None Effect otherwise &c

Your petition humbly pray that your worship would be pleased to order and appoint Commissioners to examine evidences in relation to the bounds of a tract of land belonging to your petitioner (said tract late discovery) and your petitioner as in duty bound shall ever pray. Wherefore it is considered by

the Justice here that a Commission Issue to the sd Nicholas Warren as by the petition sd is granted and that James Rownd, Edward Rownd, Francis Bredare and Joseph Gray are of Somerset County to be Commissioners and Execute the same Commission according to act of asembly in such case made and provided &c

Mary Richards

John Turpin of Somerset County Clerk brings his servant

swoman named Mary Richards into Court and pray that she may be

adjudged to serve for thirty six days that she had absented herself out of

his service, and for trouble and charge in taking up when Runaway, Whereupon it is considered by the Court here that the sd Mary Richards owe the sd John Turpin his heirs or assigns, seven days for every day that she absented herself out of his servitude, which amounts too two hundred and fifty two days, also the sd Mary Richards is adjudged to serve her said Master his heirs or assigns one hundred and twenty days being full satisfaction for two hundred pounds of tobacco paid on and of taking her up when Runaway &c, the said two hundred and fifty two days and one hundred and twenty days amounts in the whole to three hundred and seventy two days which is adjudged full satisfaction for the Runaway time and charge in taking up as sd, which said servitude is to commence at the expiration of her servitude already commenced &c

Ordered by the Court that Adam Spence Junr be Overseer and Bear the Road further than his former

limits viz to Bear a load through a swamp called Arons Swamp and that William Brittingham, Labourer, Prior Webb, Dunmore Dennis Junr, Geo: Mumford and Widow Dredows Labourers be added to the said Adam Spence and that Mr W Burnell vs the load be Bearer &c
