The said Lewis Boweke, both Reale and personall, and that the afofe Daniel Houston give good Securitie to satisfy  
with the Law in Relation to gardians &c. Whereupon the afofe Daniel Houston with John Brittingham and Isaac

Whelan his Securitie are present here in Court in their proper persons acknowledging themselves to owe and stand  
justly indebted unto the afofe Lewis Boweke in the Sum of One hundred pounds Current money good and lawfull  
money of Maryland of their goods and Chattells Lands and tenements for the use of the afofe Lewis Boweke his  
heirs or assigns severally to be made and levied if default be made in the condition hereunder written.

The condition of the above Recouerance is such that if the above bound Daniel  
Houston do and shall, well and truly conyng with the law in Every respect in Relation to the gardianship  
of, and likewise quietly and peaceably deliver up unto the afofe Lewis Boweke all his Estate that  
he hath in his hands both Reale and Personall when he shall arrive at full age to Receive the same  
that the above recognisance to be void and of None Effect otherwise &c.

humbly pray that your worlshipp would be pleased to order and appoint Commissioners  
to examine evidence in Relation to the bound of about of land belonging to your petitioner called  
(lastly late discovery) and your petitioner as in duty bound shall ever pray. Nicholas + Warren

The petition afofe being Read and heard and fully understood

Wherefore it is considered by  
the Justies here that a Commission I issue to the afofe Nicholas Warren as by the petition afofe is graunted  
and that James Round, Edward Rounde, Sarah Bridgeman and Joseph Gray all of somersett County gentle  
be Commissioners and execute the same Commission according to act of Assembly in such case made and  
provided &c.

Mary Richards

John Turpin of somersett County Gentleman his Servant  
judged for Runawaye woman named Mary Richards into Court and pray that she may be

adjudged to serve for thirty Six days that she had absented herself out off  
her Service, and for trouble and charge in taking up when Runaway, Whereupon it is considered  
by the Court here that the afofe Mary Richards have the afofe John Turpin his heirs or assigns, Seven day  
foreverday that she absented herself out of his servitude, which amounts too two hundred and  
fifty two days, also the afofe Mary Richards is adjudged to serve her said Master his heirs or assigns  
one hundred and twenty days being full satisfaction for two hundred pounds afofe to be paid on and  
off taking her up when Runaway, the said two hundred and fifty two days and three hundred  
and twenty days amounts in the whole to three hundred and Seventy two days <sup>which</sup> is adjudged full  
satisfaction for the Runawaye woman and charge in taking up as afofe, while said servitude is to commence  
at the Expiration of her servitude already commenced &c.

Ordered by the Court that Adam Spence and be Overseer and keep the Road further than his former

limits by to bear along through adway called Aaron Swans and that William Brittingham Labourer,  
Prior Webb, Dunwook Denswick, Geo: Mumford and Widow Dredous Labourers be added to the said  
Adam Spence and that M<sup>r</sup> Gurnall vs the road be charged &c.
