Mackmore of Somerset County Gentlemen according to the Statute, and Judgment to be given on their return as
of this Court, and day is given to the ap Barlye here under next Court to hear thereof, their Judgment of
Upon the premises ap.

All which said next Court to wit the nineteenth day of November and Dowd one
thousand seven hundred and twenty eight. Came againe as well the ap Adam Muir as the ap Eli: Dashiell
by their attorneys ap, and likewise came here the ap John Hardy and James Mackmore and made return to the
Court their award in the premises ap as followeth to wit. by virtue of a Commission to us directed bearing date
the 23^d day of August 1728 Out of the Court of Somerset County to audit accounts Between Adam Muir Esq
and Elizabeth Dashiell's deff, and having taken upon us the burthen thereof and hearing the allegations of both
parties Examining the accounts and hearing the Evidence on both sides to us produced do award that Eli:
Dashiell pay the said Muir the quantity of six thousand merchantable Lige Slaves at fifty five shillings
of Thousand and the remainder of his account in form and Borne at Country Price, the Balance of said
Muir's account being twenty eight pounds one shilling and three pence three farthings as witness our hands
and Seals this 26th day of September and Dowd 1728.

Therefore it is considered that the ap Adam Muir Recover against the ap Eli: Dashiell's deff
as ap the sum of twenty eight pounds one shilling and three pence three farthings, to be paid as follows
to wit, six thousand Merchantable Lige Slaves at fifty five shillings of Thousand, and the remainder of
the ap twenty eight pounds one shilling and three pence three farthings, to be paid in form and Borne at
Country Price, his Damages ap by reason of the premises as also four hundred and thirty nine
pounds of tobacco for his loss and Charges to the same Adam at his request by the Court here of his apent adjudg.
ed of the goods and Chattels which were of the ap Christopher Dashiell at the time of his death in the hands
of the same Eli: to be administered, if so much in her hands she hath, and if so much in her hands she hath
not, then the loss ap of the proper goods and Chattels of the ap Eli: to be levied, and the ap debt in
money &c.

parliament made in the sixth Year of her late Majesties Reign for the ascertaining the rates of
foreign Coines in the plantations which to him he owes, and from him he unjustly detains &c.

AND whereupon the same John Hobard by George Dashiell his attorney (supplains
that whereas the ap Benjamin Sharpe the twenty sixth day of June and Dowd one thousand seven
hundred and twenty seven at Somerset County within the Jurisdiction of this Court by his certain
writing obligatory Granted himselfe hold and truly bound unto the same John in the sum of
twenty pounds current Lawfull money of America to be paid the same John when afterwards
