His Lordship Maryland:

John Hollows I Doin one thousand seven hundred & twenty seven before us

Lord Proprietarys Justices of the Peace for the County of Somerset
County Weaver with William Cotton of the same place Esquire his Security

And acknowledged themselves to owe and stand truly Indebted unto the Lord Proprietary of this Province in the Sum of fifty pounds Item of their goods and Chattels Lands and tenements Separately to be Liquid for & due of the said Lord Proprietary his heirs & Successors if Default be made in the Condition hereunto Annexed

The Condition of which Recognizance is Such that if the above Bounden John Hollows shall well and truly make his personell Appearance before his Lordships Justices of the Peace for Somerset County at about to be held at Dingy Creek in the County the third Tuesday of June next ensuing the Date hereof then & there to answer his said Lordship concerning such matters and things as shall be then & there objected against him on his said Lordships behalfe and do stand and abide of Judgment of the Court thereupon you do not Depart the Court without Leave there of then this Recognizance to be void

At which said third Tuesday of June to wit the twentieth day of the same month Ann Dowd one thousand seven hundred & twenty seven came to the Court here into Court and prays that her appearance may be soe ordered to save herself & Security from the above Recognizance of Bail & for as much as no person appeared to prosecute on behalfe of the Lord Proprietary and thereupon said John Hollows appearance is recorded and he and his Security accordingly discharged

Martin Genton appears according to his Recognizance Entered into to give Evidence against Margrett Lindors and was discharged therefrom

Charles Ballard appears according to his Recognizance entered into, to give evidence against Margt Lindors and was accordingly discharged therefrom

Richard Blunkett appears according to his Recognizance entered into, to give Evidence against Peter Fitzgerrell, and is accordingly discharged therefrom

Benjamin Lebrue appears according to his Recognizance entered into, to give evidence on behalfe of the Proprietary against David Burgin and is discharged therefrom
