Edmond Fullin aged thirty nine years or thereabouts Deposeth on the Holy Evangelist of almighty God saith that about twenty year agoe this Depo^{unt} James Curtiss was often feeding logs in a place called Long Ridge now claimed by Daniel Hull at a Hog pen near Wager End of the said tract of Land at several times he desired this Depo^{unt} being a young man to take Notice of a mark on a white Oak standing in the side of Murrumsco Dam being the same tree as the Depo^{unt} is at in presents of the Commissioners & all persons concerned as the upper most boundary on the said side of the Land this Depo^{unt} further saith that he has often gone along the small path close by the tree mentioned in Timothy Swillever's Deposition in Longway with this Master James Curtiss & that he this Depo^{unt} never heard the said Curtiss say directly or indirectly of a Boundary mentioned by Swillever was anything relating to the Land he said Curtiss then owned called Long Ridge but frequently bid him take Notice of a white tree recited in the above Instrument & further saith not

William Catlin aged forty two years or thereabouts Deposeth on the Holy Evangelist of almighty God saith that where an old burnt stump of white Oak near murrumsco Dam side now stands was the place or thereabouts to the best of his knowledge where there stood a marked white Oak tree which tree this Depo^{unt} father told him was the first Boundary of his Land called Long Ridge now claimed by Daniel Hull & this Depo^{unt} further saith that when the Law was in force for allowing four p^{ts} of 100 p^{ts} of Head for Squerrills he was Hunting for Squerrills & then he saw the tree above mentioned fairly marked with sixteen Notches & further saith not

The Deposition of Adam Hitch aged sixty nine years relating to prove the Bounds of a certain tract of Land called Long Ridge taken this 28 day of Septem^r 1728 and being sworn on the Holy Evangelist of almighty God saith that about thirty four years agoe he Bought of Rob^t Catlin 135 Acres of Land laying on Murrumsco Dam or branch called Long Ridge & said Catlin told him that the great white Oak standing by the path side is a boundary of Long Ridge & said Long's Land it being the same tree as Randal Mitchell & Daniel Long made Prob^{at} of to be Samuel Long's Boundary, and further said Hitch saith that a great white Oak standing up the Branch or Dam near the Mouth of a small Branch that Edmond Fullen made Oak to that Robert Catlin told him the said tree was the upper Boundary of Long Ridge
