him an Order to turn the Road that leads over the beaver dam through his
plantation to turn it round the fence your Petitioner will oblige himself it shall be on bet-
ter ground and your petitioner shall be ever in duty bound to pray for you
The Petition ap^d be read and heard and fully understood, It is therefore
considered by the Justices that the ap^d Edward Karger turn the Road as by the Petition ap^d
is prayd, he marking the new Road according to the direction of Mr. Francis Allen &c.
