worlgs that my negro Jack hath been unable to earn his bread for three years by reason
of severall infirmitie, having been twice shalld for his sickness besides other means admiss-
ible to the great charge of the Belitioner may it therefore please your worlgs to grant that he
may be tax free and your Belitioner as in duty bound shall pray

The petition and being Read and heard and mature deliberation thereupon had &c —
Wherefore it is considered by the Court here that the afo Negro Jack belonging to the afo John
white be for the future tax free as by the petition afo is prayd &c

Dick an negro boy belonging to John Davis is adjudged by the Court to be of the age of ten years

Kirke Gunby comes into Court in his proper person, and bring with him a certain Mary
Richard his Servant woman and produceth an account against her that she had absented her
self out of his service twenty three days, and four hundred pounds of tobacco paid for
taking her up when she ran away afo, and pray the Court that the said Mary Richard
may be adjudged to serve him according to act of Assembly, for the runaway time afo and
for the tobacco paid afo — Whereupon all and Singular his remissness Considered and
