Whereupon the aforesaid Johnson Hill present here in Court acknowledged himself to owe & be indebted unto the said John Richardson in the sum of twenty pounds Sterling good & lawfull money of England to be levied upon his body goods or Chattels lands or tenements for the use of the said John Richardson, in case therefore he doth not comply with the covenants and £20 —
