and say that he cannot gainsay but that he hath all the lights and credits of the said Andrew Wailey
to the value of five pounds curr. money of Maryland, nor but that the same ought to be
condemned in his hands for the value of the said Joseph Mifflin or of the Rights and
Credits of the said Andrew Wailey, which the said Bish doth not gainsay -

Whereupon the aforesaid Joseph Mifflin prayeth that the sum so as aforesaid
conferred by the said Lewis Hale or of the lights and credits of the said Andrew Wailey,
may be condemned in his hands off the aforesaid Joseph Venables and Lewis Hale towards -
satisfying unto the aforesaid Joseph Mifflin his damages and costs of suit recovered against him
according to act of assembly in such case made and provided and all costs accruing upon
the writ of attachment aforesaid -

Therefore it is considered by the Court here that the aforesaid
sum of Twelve pounds six pence and eleven pence sterl. money part of the sum so attached
and conferred before named in the hands of the said Joseph Venables or of the Rights and
Credits of the said Andrew Wailey towards satisfying unto the said Joseph Mifflin his damages
and costs of certain judgment recovered against him or also all the costs accruing upon the
writ of attachment aforesaid and that the aforesaid Joseph Mifflin have thereof his execution against the
said Joseph Venables according to act of assembly aforesaid.

Therefore it is considered by the Court here that the aforesaid sum of two pd.
