Ordered by the Court that Philip Taylor pay unto William Carter four hundred and twenty pounds of  
tobacco being due unto him for his attendance, as an Evidence fourteen days for the said Philip Taylor against  
John Denton the hearing made Oath to the same £60 -

Ordered by the Court that Philip Taylor pay unto George Riggi two hundred and ~~ten~~ <sup>one</sup> pounds of  
tobacco being due unto him for his attendance seven days as an Evidence for the said Philip Taylor against

Ordered by the Court that Mr. John Fieldwell and Mr. John Hardy agree with some person to keep  
Jefferson an object of Party till next November Court and find her such Receipts

Ordered by the Court that Capt John Scott and Thomas Hayward agree with some person to
